Best Practice: The Spanish Carol Concert – Jamaica

A celebration of language, music, culture, and diplomacy

Why was this initiative created?

The Spanish Carol Concert was created to transform the way Spanish is taught and experienced in Jamaican schools. Traditional classroom teaching often limits students' exposure to authentic use of the language. Recognizing this gap, Spanish educator Emma-June Bell launched the initiative in 2005 as a creative platform where students could practice Spanish through music, performance, and cultural expression.

Christmas music deeply rooted in both Jamaican tradition and Hispanic heritage, offered the perfect context to build motivation, confidence, and fluency while strengthening cultural understanding. The initiative also responds to national goals to increase Spanish proficiency as part of Jamaica's regional integration strategy.

What is it about?

The Spanish Carol Concert initiative is a national cultural and educational programme held annually in Kingston, St. Ann and St. James. Each concert brings together students from primary, secondary, and tertiary institutions, from both public and private schools, to perform Christmas carols (villancicos), Bible readings, poems, and dramatic pieces in Spanish. Most participants are Spanish language learners, many preparing for national and regional examinations, who use the concert as a meaningful and engaging platform to apply their language skills in real-life performance.

The programme is formally endorsed and jointly coordinated by the Ministry of Education, Skills, Youth & Information (MoESYI), Spanish Embassy, the Spanish-Jamaican Foundation (SJF), and, most recently, the Simón Bolívar Cultural Centre. This collaborative structure strengthens national ownership and ensures alignment with Jamaica's foreign language education goals and cultural development priorities.

All concerts highlight authentic Hispanic Christmas traditions from countries such as Spain, Mexico, Colombia, Chile, Panama, Cuba, Ecuador, Argentina, Venezuela, bringing cultural diversity to Jamaican audiences. Performances are free of charge and hosted in public venues to encourage broad community participation. Donors and sponsors also support the initiative by providing refreshments and snacks to participating students, which helps promote well-being and sustainability.

A key feature of the programme is its commitment to equity and inclusion. It purposefully engages underserved and rural schools while providing performance opportunities for students with special educational needs. During the COVID-19 pandemic, in 2020, the concert successfully transitioned to digital submissions, enabling schools across the island to continue participating despite logistical challenges.

How It Works

- Schools form cultural teams led by Jamaican and Spanish-speaking teachers, who
 guide students in pronunciation, stagecraft, cultural interpretation, and musical
 preparation.
- Hispanic embassies adopt schools and offer mentorship by providing cultural materials, language support, costumes, and music coaching.
- Performances include choral singing, dance, dramatization, spoken word, music ensembles, and sign-supported interpretation, allowing multiple forms of artistic expression.
- Each choir or group performs a Spanish carol (villancico) that reflects the traditions of a Hispanic country through music, costume, and storytelling.
- The programme promotes charity and community spirit, collecting donations for children's homes, hospitals, and community outreach projects as part of Christmas giving.
- Local donors and corporate partners contribute by providing refreshments and support services to participating students, enhancing the event atmosphere and student experience.

The Spanish Carol Concert is a joyful, inclusive learning space rooted in communicative language teaching, task-based learning, and arts integration. It brings Spanish to life beyond the classroom and uses music as a bridge for education, cultural exchange, and unity.

Who makes it possible?

The Spanish Carol Concert thrives thanks to a strong network of public, private, and community partners, whose collaboration ensures the programme's sustainability, cultural richness, and educational impact. At the core of the event are the students from primary, secondary, and tertiary levels across Jamaica, who prepare and perform with enthusiasm each year, showcasing their talent, creativity, and love for the Spanish language. Coordinating this vibrant initiative are the Ministry of Education, Youth & Information (MoEYI), the Embassy of Spain in Jamaica, the Spanish-Jamaican Foundation (SJF), and the Simón Bolívar Cultural Centre, providing guidance, resources, and oversight to participating schools.

The concert is further supported by diplomatic, corporate, and community actors, as well as professional educators, ensuring that students have the mentorship, materials, and support needed to deliver high-quality, culturally immersive performances. The National Association of Spanish Teachers (ANPE) also plays a key role, collaborating in event promotion, live broadcasts, and coordination across schools, helping to extend participation and visibility.

The Spanish Carol Concert unites key partners who collaborate to ensure its success:

Leadership Team:

- Ministry of Education, Youth & Information (MoEYI): Oversees planning and ensures alignment with national education goals.
- Embassy of Spain in Jamaica: Coordinates the participation of the diplomatic corps.
- Spanish-Jamaican Foundation (SJF): Designs and supports the programme in line with cultural objectives.

• Simón Bolívar Cultural Centre: Provides the venue and assists with student preparation.


Core Stakeholders

What makes the Spanish Carol Concert initiative a long-standing and noteworthy cultural initiative?

The Spanish Carol Concert is a flagship national initiative that transforms Spanish language learning into a vibrant public celebration of Christmas, faith, and cultural unity. Rooted in Jamaica's strong religious and choral traditions, the programme honours the true spirit of Christmas as a time of reunion, peace, joy, and goodwill. Through music, students internalize these universal values while developing linguistic competence, creativity, and confidence. It is more than a concert, it is a celebration of character, culture, and connection.

What sets this initiative apart is its powerful model of collaborative cultural diplomacy. The programme unites all Hispanic embassies in Jamaica, each adopting schools and sharing Christmas traditions that reflect the diversity of the Spanish-speaking world. Many of these carols, customs, and expressions are rarely seen in Jamaica, making the event an unforgettable intercultural experience. It also reinforces regional brotherhood by building bridges of friendship between Jamaica, Latin America, and the wider Caribbean through education and the performing arts.

The Spanish Carol Concert experience stands out because it:

- Transforms language learning through music, using Christmas carols as immersive tools that reinforce grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation, and phonetics in a joyful and memorable way.
- Applies Spanish in meaningful real-life contexts, allowing students to use the language authentically through artistic performance, storytelling, and public speaking.
- Connects education with cultural diplomacy by uniting learning and international collaboration in a national programme supported by Hispanic embassies.
- Showcases authentic Hispanic Christmas traditions, highlighting the cultural richness of Latin America and Spain and introducing songs, customs, and expressions rarely known in Jamaica.
- Celebrates Jamaican creativity through cultural fusion, blending Hispanic traditions with Jamaican rhythms, choreography, and costume design.
- Reflects strong values and heritage, aligning with Jamaica's spiritual traditions and the Christmas principles of peace, kindness, gratitude, service, and family unity.
- Promotes inclusion and student empowerment by welcoming learners of all ages and abilities, including those with special educational needs, and giving them the confidence to perform and excel.
- Strengthens community partnerships by engaging teachers, parents, schools, and local organisations in a shared celebration that builds unity and national pride.
- Encourages compassion and service by integrating charity initiatives that support community causes and nurture empathy and social responsibility among students.
- Demonstrates innovation and resilience by adapting to virtual formats during the COVID-19 pandemic, in 2020, and later expanding live performances to include steel bands, choirs, dance ensembles, and instrumental groups.
- Offers a unique model, blending language education, intercultural exchange, and the performing arts in a festive celebration of Christmas and cultural unity.

By combining language education with cultural values and international collaboration, the Spanish Carol Concert continues to strengthen Jamaica's educational landscape while promoting regional unity. It stands as a model of how music and language together can cultivate character, cultural awareness, and global citizenship.

What difference has the initiative made?

The initiative has made a profound impact on students, schools, and the wider community by blending education, culture, diplomacy, and social engagement in meaningful and lasting ways. Each year, Hispanic embassies actively support schools, offering students a unique opportunity to learn first-hand about different countries and their traditions through music, language, and cultural exchange.

Students eagerly prepare for weeks to perfect their performances, and the steady participation of 20–30 schools, representing hundreds of learners, reflects the programme's popularity and continued relevance across all levels of education. Through performance-based Spanish language learning, concerts strengthen linguistic competence, deepen intercultural understanding, and foster confidence and personal growth.

Beyond the classroom, the initiative promotes dialogue between nations, encourages community collaboration, and involves both families and educators. Its influence extends to educational, cultural, diplomatic, and social dimensions, making the Spanish Carol Concerts a model of how artistic and linguistic initiatives can bring people together and enrich national education and community life.

Educational Impact

- Improved Spanish pronunciation, confidence, and fluency through immersive rehearsals and public performances.
- Increased motivation for language learning by providing authentic, meaningful, and joyful contexts for applying Spanish.
- Enhanced student performance in CSEC oral examinations and other academic milestones.
- Encouraged students to pursue scholarships, study abroad, and participate in cultural exchanges.

- Creates a bridge between Jamaica and the Hispanic world, fostering meaningful connections and cultural exchange.

The programme offers a replicable model for other contexts seeking to promote language learning through creative, participatory, and culturally meaningful approaches.
